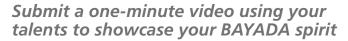

### **Raising Our Voices for Our Loved Ones**

My father served in the Air Force, has been married to his wife, Dorothy, for nearly 52 years, raised four children in Berks County, and worked until the age of 73.

After a freak accident on September 16, 2013, Dad broke his neck, severely damaged his spinal cord, and left him with quadriplegia. Since then, he's needed 24-hour care.

My 70-year-old mother needed to quit her job to become his full-time caregiver, and my siblings and I became part-time caregivers. Dad can't feed himself, bathe himself, use the bathroom, or turn himself at night. He needs 168 hours of care every week.

In January 2014, we applied for a Medicaid home and community-based waiver program to try to get some help. We finally heard back in April, and Dad's income was \$17-a-month too much. He was denied because there is no spend-down option for home and community-based services.

Our family is exhausted and overwhelmed. We need the Pennsylvania government to change the eligibility rules to let Dad get the care he needs. Fortunately, BAYADA provides us with an easy way to communicate Dad's needs to our legislators—through the BAYADA Legislative Advocacy Center website.

Some of you may have different struggles or need other rules changed to get the care your loved ones need. You can also join BAYADA's Legislative Advocacy Center and connect with your legislators to share these concerns and barriers.

# Unstoppable: Even with Quadriplegia, Nicole Ficarra Sees Her Life as an Adventure



**Nicole Ficarra** of Deer Park, NY, has no memory of the car accident that left her with a traumatic spinal cord injury when she was just three years old. While riding with some family members in her dad's car, Nicole sustained the most serious injuries

of all the passengers when the vehicle was rear-ended by another, pushing theirs into a telephone pole.

Now, as a 24 year-old woman, Nicole has been living with quadriplegia and a tracheostomy for 21 years. But to say she has just "lived" without the use of her legs and with limited movement in her arms would be an injustice to her, for Nicole has done so much more than that. In fact, to say she has "thrived" would be a more accurate word that she, her family, her friends, and her caregivers would use to describe her life since then.

"I'm a typical 24-year-old," says Nicole. "I go with my friends to the movies, to bars, to the mall. We have a lot of fun. We just never stop."

Nicole has the kind of energy and motivation that even many able-bodied young people do not. Last year she earned a bachelor's degree in advertising from the New York Institute of Technology and is now interning as a social media coordinator. With tremendous determination, Nicole has learned to write, use a computer on her own, and deftly maneuver her power wheelchair.

There have been many people along the way who have helped Nicole live life as normally as possible. She has had the support of her family as well as round-theclock nursing to help her stay safe at home and wherever life takes her.

"My BAYADA Nurses help me with my medication, suctioning my trach, and with all the things I need to do during the day. They even stay with me at night," explains Nicole. "I especially love that most of my nurses are about my age so I can really relate to them. They are like friends."

In fact, Nicole and her BAYADA Nurses have had some really great adventures together. Two of them accompanied her on a Disney cruise last year and are going with her again on an upcoming Caribbean cruise that she is taking with her girlfriends. "They're there to take care of me, but it'll also be a lot of fun to be with them. It'll just be us girls. I can't wait!"

Although she's really looking forward to her vacation, Nicole has even bigger plans in mind: she wants to secure a full-time job where she can earn enough money to get her own apartment.

"I have always lived with my parents, but now I would love to have my own place," says Nicole. "That is definitely one of my biggest goals."

With her positive attitude and continued support from her family and nurses, Nicole's dream of independence is surely not "if," but "when." ■

# Father on Hospice Sees His Daughter Wed with Help from BAYADA's Pennsylvania Boyertown Hospice

Vincent G. had been receiving palliative care from the Pennsylvania Boyertown Hospice BAYADA office since January. After being diagnosed with melanoma at 58 yearsold, he wanted to spend the last months of his life living with peace and comfort, surrounded by the people he loved.

His family wanted to do all that they could to make sure his last days were memorable. That's why his 21-year-old daughter, Melissa, took a leave from college to help with her father's care. After interacting with Melissa, our BAYADA Nurses found out that she was engaged to her longtime boyfriend. The nurses asked her if she wanted BAYADA to help arrange a ceremony at home so her father could see her wed.

Melissa said yes and the thought went from an idea to a reality within 24 hours. During Valentine's Day week, their team at BAYADA scheduled an officiant and had local companies donate flowers, a wedding cake, and other accompaniments to make the day special.

Though Vincent was bedbound and spoke minimally at the end, he was still coherent.

After witnessing his daughter's wedding vow exchange, he gave a "thumbs up" to the couple. Vincent and his wife also renewed their own wedding vows during the ceremony.



Vincent passed only 24 hours after the service in February. His family was appreciative that those few final days—usually the most difficult for families—became days that they will always remember fondly.

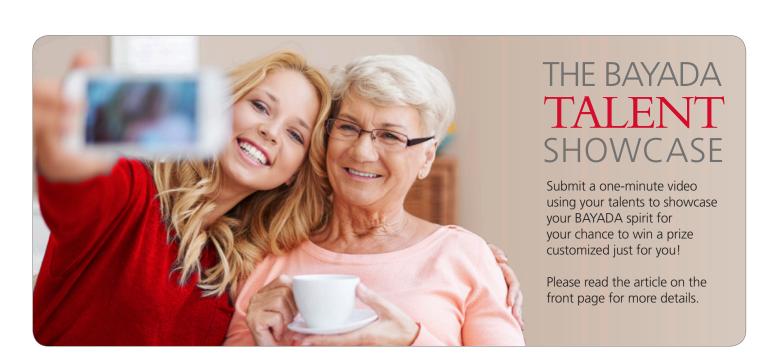
