Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), often referred to as "Lou Gehrig's Disease," is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord. When the motor neurons die, the ability of the brain to initiate and control muscle movement is lost. People in the later stages of the disease may experience total paralysis, including losing the ability to speak, all while maintaining complete awareness and cognition. # BAYADA clients help educate legislators about the value of home care

Kelly Z. was a healthy child who loved being a dancer and a cheerleader, until 14 years ago, when a mysterious brain stem disorder left her paralyzed and dependent on a ventilator. In 2010, Kelly, along with her mother Kathy and her nurses, made the difficult journey to Trenton, NJ for BAYADA Day, where their emotional story made a profound impact on the state legislators in attendance.

Throughout the country, clients and their loved ones have travelled to their state capitals for BAYADA Days: annual events designed to thank legislators for their support and educate them about the important work that BAYADA does

to offer high quality health care at a lower cost. In addition to legislative events, BAYADA clients such as Jackie B., 67, have welcomed lawmakers into their homes so that they can see,

firsthand, how home health care can lead to an improved quality of life for people with disabilities.

During his visit with Jackie, NC State Senator Fletcher Hartsell remarked, "Jackie has been able to remain in the same house since he was born, and he is where he wants to be, with his family. This simple fact that nurses from BAYADA have been able to keep Jackie out of the hospital for two and a half years is a huge benefit for our state." Legislative events and home visits are made possible through the BAYADA Government Affairs Office (GAO). Under the leadership of Chief Marketing and Government Affairs Officer **Dave Totaro**, GAO acts as a voice for our clients and employees in the legislative process.

"We welcome and encourage clients to become involved in advocacy so that they can share their story and truly make a difference," shared Dave. "We will continue to advocate on behalf of our clients to ensure they have ease of access to home health care services and that our home health care professionals receive the fair wages they most certainly deserve."

### Disease-specific training helps BAYADA professionals care for clients

At BAYADA, we provide home health care to our clients with the highest professional, ethical, and safety standards because we believe our clients come first. We achieve this goal by continuously improving our work through evaluation, education, and training. ~The BAYADA Way

This year, our BAYADA Assistive Care and Adult Nursing Specialty Practices are focused on developing specialized programs to provide our caregivers with disease-specific training. By providing this additional specialized training and increasing our employees' knowledge base, our health care professionals will be better able to meet our clients' needs and support them in the comfort of their homes.

The number of individuals affected by Alzheimer's disease continues to grow each year. According to a study conducted by the Rush Institute for Healthy Living, the number of Americans that will be affected by Alzheimer's disease is projected to reach 13.8 million by 2050, making this one of the most prevalent diseases impacting the senior population.

Clients with Alzheimer's require special care and the BAYADA Assistive Care Specialty Practice is in the process of piloting a dementia-specific training program with six BAYADA offices. The training will provide BAYADA health care professionals with the education they need to identify cognitive functions impaired by dementia. They will also learn strategies and techniques to help intervene when challenging situations occur during all stages of this disease.

Through our partnership with the ALS Associate and their National Care Services team, we are creating a specialized program to help our health care professionals recognize and understand the needs of our clients with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis

(ALS)—also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease.

This year, our goal is to complete the ALS training program for home health aides (HHAs). Once the HHA has completed an inservice, they will then be eligible to take the ALS certified training course. A similar training for nurses is slated for 2014. Both the inservice and the certified training course will focus on the unique care and needs of clients with ALS at every stage of the disease, including emotional and psychosocial support.

## BAYADA Simulation Labs help professionals and family caregivers

In our last edition of *CARE Connection*, the Pediatric Specialty Practice shared the opening of two regional simulation (SIM) labs that will be used to help us provide state-of-the-art training for BAYADA Nurses.

Here's how it works. The BAYADA Sim Lab uses realistic simulator mannequins and computer software to generate realistic client emergency scenarios. The lab "clients" present symptoms, which prompt an assessment and intervention by the

nurse. The mannequins can present symptoms such as cyanosis; coughing; realistic lung, heart, or bowel sounds; airway occlusion; and respiratory distress.

The hands-on training available in the lab is intended to promote the competence, confidence, and advancement opportunities of our field and office nurses. Our desire is to improve upon our quality of care and symptom management for the medically fragile and clinically

complex clients we serve.

Our specialized labs also offer the opportunity for families to come in and practice skills in a safe environment. These skills may include listening to breath sounds, administering respiratory treatments, changing trach tubes, ventilator management, and other specialized skills that may apply to their loved one. This allows families to feel more comfortable with certain procedures and equipment

before bringing their loved one home from a hospital or facility.

In Pennsylvania, several pediatric offices have been piloting a portable computerized simulation lab, called mid-fidelity simulation. BAYADA Pediatrics Director of Recruiting and Retention **Michael Ward** comments, "Our hope is to use these portable simulators to provide education and training to parents and family caregivers who are not able to travel to a BAYADA office for training". Here are just a few comments from nurses and the parent of a pediatric client who have completed the training in the simulation lab:

After having difficulties keeping a job, one of Kirk's counselors recommended that he schedule an appointment for a complete evaluation. In April 2004, Kirk was diagnosed with Asperger's and was given the resources and additional support he needed to live his life independently.

Kirk has his own apartment and is very appreciative of his personal support team. Along with support from his parents, Kirk works closely with his Case Manager Kimberly H., TEACCH Therapist Jenna S, BAYADA Director **Terrie Filer**, and his BAYADA Habilitation Technician **AJ Frazier**.

Kirk receives In-Home Skills Building from BAYADA—a service included in the NC Innovations Waiver program providing habilitation, training, and instruction combined with elements of support, supervision, and engaging participation. The service can be provided in the client's

private home or in a variety of community settings which the client chooses to attend.

Kirk loves to volunteer and stay active in his community. Kirk explains, "I want to give back what I am getting." Kirk attends two local churches and is involved in the children's ministry, choir, and organ. He also loves to volunteer at the local nursing home, Lincoln Theater Guild, and local Republican Party, and dress up as a clown for community and birthday events!

One of Kirk's favorite things to do is to photography, and he volunteers at the local paper—*The Lincoln Herald Newspaper*. He has his own press pass, desk, and computer. Kirk especially loves to photograph sporting events, such as high school and college football games.
